

SPICE Training Announcement

A SPICE beginner's training class will be hosted by Arizona State University on May 26/27, 2020. (This is right after the Labor Day holiday.) An estimated 15 - 20 seats will be available. This class is expected to be somewhat similar to the traditional training classes offered by NAIF except that it will be compressed into two days. The exact topics to be covered are TBD. There will be no fee for the class, but attendees must arrange/pay their own travel expenses and meals.
